<p>Reasons(s)</p>	<p>The proposals included within the report would see over £2 million invested in Breckland over the next three years. The money would be spent on supporting the vibrancy of the market towns and their heritage; funding local good causes and recognising the important work that they do; keeping Breckland a safe place to live and work; marketing the opportunities that are present within areas for residents; visitors and businesses alike; supporting the most vulnerable and helping residents to take care of themselves and protect themselves from harm.</p>
