**Subject:** Flexible Homelessness Support Grant

**Purpose:** To seek agreement for the release of the Flexible Homelessness Support Grant

### **Recommendation(s):**

That Council accepts and releases funds to the value of £189,241 provided under the Flexible Homelessness Support Grant.

That the Executive Director for Place, in consultation with the Executive Member of Growth is granted delegated authority to commit and agree to the spend in accordance with the conditions of the Flexible Homelessness Grant.

### **1.0 BACKGROUND**

- 1.1 The Department for Communities and Local Government announced that arrangements for the administration of the Flexible Homelessness Grant in March 2017.
- 1.2 The Flexible Homelessness Support Grant is designed to transform the way councils fund homelessness services to give them greater flexibility to prioritise the prevention of homelessness. It is described as a radical replacement of the tightly controlled funding currently given to source and manage temporary accommodation for homeless individuals and their families.
- 1.3 The former Chancellor, George Osborne MP, announced at Autumn Statement 2015 that the Department for Work and Pensions' temporary accommodation management fee would be replaced by a Department for Communities and Local Government grant from April 2017..
- 1.4 The grant effectively empowers councils with the freedom to support a full range of homelessness services. This could include employing a homelessness prevention or tenancy support officer to work closely with people who are at risk of losing their homes.

### **2.0 OPTIONS**

- 2.1 Do nothing
- 2.2 Agree to the release of funds relating to the Flexible Homelessness Grant.
- 2.3 Where the conditions of the grant are satisfied, agreement that the Executive Director of Place in accordance with the Executive Member for Growth is given delegated authority to spend the grant.

### 3.0 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 3.1 The first recommendation is necessary for the grant to be utilised and committed.
- 3.2 As an operational grant to assist in the prevention of homelessness, the second recommendation will mean that the grant can be accessed in both a planned and reactive manner with the intention of supporting the Council to prevent homelessness.
- 3.3 This grant will support spend from the Breckland Council provided Homelessness Prevention Fund and will look to achieve a saving from this area of spend.

### 4.0 EXPECTED BENEFITS

- 4.1 This grant will support the Housing Team in preventing homelessness within Breckland.

The flexible nature of this grant means that it can be used in both a planned and reactive manner. An assessment of need has been undertaken within the Housing Service to determine what additional services could be secured to support the prevention of homelessness using this fund.

This is the second year that this grant has been made available to Breckland. It is proposed that the grant will be used to continue strengthening resource within the Housing Service whilst looking for new and innovative approaches to prevent and reduce the risk of homelessness within Breckland.

These funds will also assist in supporting the Council to continue responding to the increased demand resulting from the implementation of the Homelessness Reduction Act which came into force on the 1<sup>st</sup> April 2018.
