However having looked at the Licensing Act and the four licensing objectives, my object to the granting the additional 15 days and any outside music at all falls within the prevention of public nuisance.

This is a quiet village, its not Glastonbury and I don't see why I and my fellow neighbours should be subjected to listening to other peoples entertainment at any time of the day never mind the additional 15 days requested, given the close proximity of the pub to its surrounding properties.

As a music licence at this pub was I believe previously turned down a few years ago I cannot see why one should be granted now irrespective of the Act
