| Positive cases (cumulative) | 11,518 | 21,656 | +10,138 | As of 31/12/21, the number of positive cases in Breckland since the start of the pandemic stood at 21,656. |
| Deaths within 28 days of a positive test (cumulative) | 304 | 330 | +26 | Since the start of the pandemic, there have been 330 deaths within the district where a positive test was recorded within 28 days of the date of death. |
| # of residents who have received 1 dose of the vaccine (cumulative) | 108,566 | 112,849 | +4,283 | Currently, those 12 and upwards are eligible for both the first and second dose of the vaccine. Those 18 and upwards are also eligible for a booster jab. |
| # of residents who have received 2 doses of the vaccine (cumulative) | 101,432 | 105,876 | +4,444 | The council continues to offer support at a local level and work alongside the Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) to support uptake both across the district and in specific areas where uptake levels are lower than the rest of the district. Norfolk has been recognised nationally as a good county in terms of its approach and uptake of the vaccine. |
