Subject: Partnership working through a Section 113 agreement

Purpose: To consider ARP entering into a Section 113 agreement with Broadland District Council and South Norfolk District Council for ARP to provide Fraud services

Recommendation(s):

- 1) That Cabinet approve entering into a Section 113 agreement with Broadland District Council and South Norfolk District Council for ARP to provide Fraud services
- 2) That Cabinet instruct the Head of ARP and the ARP Operational Improvement Board to negotiate a Section 113 agreement, between the ARP partners and Broadland District Council and South Norfolk District Council, to enable ARP officers to provide Fraud services to the Councils.

Recommend to General Purposes Committee

- 3) That the Breckland staffing establishment is increased by 2 permanent FTE for the fully funded posts required to deliver the services included in the Section 113 agreement.

1.0 BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The ARP partnership consists of 5 partners and is not actively looking at new, full partners following a review by the Joint Committee and Members on 7th December 2021, instead focusing on the existing partners performance and customer journey.
- 1.2 The ARP Joint Committee did, however, agree that where it will benefit the five ARP partners, then ARP will enter into separate arrangements to provide services to other Councils regarding specific elements of their Revenues & Benefits function. Such benefits will include creating greater resilience and will generate further efficiencies to meet ARP's Medium Term Financial Strategy.
- 1.3 Section 113 of the Local Government Act 1972 enables Local Authorities to enter into an agreement as follows:
"a local authority may enter into an agreement with another local authority for the placing at the disposal of the latter for the purposes of their functions, on such terms as may be provided by the agreement, of the services of officers employed by the former, but shall not enter into any such agreement with respect to any officer without consulting him."

Matters to Consider

- 1.4 Broadland District Council and South Norfolk Council have asked ARP to provide, and will fund, fraud services. This request has been made following ARP providing a consultancy service review with an options appraisal.
- 1.5 This agreement will require an additional resource of two FTE's. The proposal is to recruit these two new posts on a permanent basis.
- 1.6 ARP Joint Committee has approved entering into this Section 113 agreement and to increase the establishment by 2 FTE.
- 1.7 Although agreed by the ARP Joint Committee, a Section 113 agreement and increase to establishment is subject to further authorisation from each partner council within ARP within their own constitutional requirements; hence Breckland Council's authorisation is sought here.

The Proposal

- 1.8 The funding agreed with Broadland and South Norfolk and the resource to be allocated to this work is considered sufficient to provide fraud services to Broadland and South Norfolk Council's in respect of Council Tax, including Council Tax Support fraud and other fraud areas, and to contribute to overheads across the partnership.
- 1.9 A negotiated Section 113 agreement to provide fraud services will enable partnership working without the need for Broadland and South Norfolk Council's to become members of the Joint Committee, and in the future may lead to other partnership opportunities.
- 1.10 Arrangements to share staff and access to systems will be coordinated as necessary. Further, providing a fraud service to Broadland District Council and South Norfolk Council will add social value to the work of the ARP and throughout Norfolk; that, in turn, might lead to other, similar approaches and opportunities.

2.0 OPTIONS

- 2.1 To agree the recommendations above.
- 2.2 Do nothing.

3.0 REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION(S)

- 3.1 Entering into a Section 113 agreement will add social value to the work of the ARP; that, in turn, might lead to other, similar approaches and opportunities.

4.0 EXPECTED BENEFITS

- 4.1 Broadland and South Norfolk Councils will provide funding in respect of ARP providing Fraud services, including the administration and management of the service. An inflationary uplift will be considered annually for staffing costs.
- 4.2 The additional resource and staffing will provide greater resilience in the existing fraud team.
- 4.3 There is potential for the provision of similar services with others.

5.0 **IMPLICATIONS**

In preparing this report, the report author has considered the likely implications of the decision - particularly in terms of Carbon Footprint / Environmental Issues; Constitutional & Legal; Contracts; Corporate Priorities; Crime & Disorder; Data Protection; Equality & Diversity/Human Rights; Financial; Health & Wellbeing; Reputation; Risk Management; Safeguarding; Staffing; Stakeholders/Consultation/Timescales; Other. Where the report author considers that there may be implications under one or more of these headings, these are identified below.

5.2 **Constitution & Legal**

5.2.1 The Section 113 agreement will be negotiated by the Head of the ARP in agreement with the ARP Operational Improvement Board and will be agreed by the Councils' legal teams.

5.5 **Financial**

5.2.1 The costs of providing the service along with administration and overheads will be covered in full by the funding from Broadland and South Norfolk Councils.

5.6 **Risk Management**

5.3.1 Whilst either party can terminate the agreement with notice, it is considered the nature of the appointments and turnover of staff within ARP is such that staff can be redeployed into the Compliance Team or other areas within ARP if required, mitigating the likelihood of redundancies.

5.7 **Staffing**

5.7.1 It is proposed that the additional staffing establishment is employed by Breckland Council and the recommendations in this report include a recommendation to General Purposes Committee regarding the increase to establishment.

5.7.2 Although the staff would be employed by Breckland, the costs will be shared throughout the ARP as with all other ARP staff.

5.8 **Stakeholders / Consultation / Timescales**

5.8.1 ARP Joint Committee have approved entering into the S113 agreement and increasing the establishment at their December 2022 meeting.

5.8.2 If approved it is proposed that the S113 agreement will take effect from 1 April 2023.
